The Chair may rule that the speaker is out of order if the comments are not germane to the item under consideration. If multiple requests for public comment are submitted on one agenda item, preference will be granted to members of the public who have not spoken previously during the meeting, either during general public comment or on another agenda item. Public officials acting in an official capacity may have their speaking time extended by the Chair.

A member of the public wishing to speak on more than one agenda item at a single meeting shall limit their remarks to a total of **three (3) minutes** per meeting. Members of the public who want to speak on multiple agenda items for up to 3 minutes at one time can choose to speak during the Multiple Agenda Items Comment period; and will be given the opportunity to also speak during General Public Comment. Requests for public comment can also be submitted to the Chair prior to the meeting via email. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. General Public Comment is limited to 15 minutes maximum. No individual speaker will be allowed more than two (2) minutes during General Public Comment unless the Chair decides differently.

EXHAUSTION OF ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDIES: If you challenge these agenda items in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing or in written correspondence on these matters delivered to this agency at or prior to the public hearing. California Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6 governs the time in which a party may seek judicial review of this determination. Under that provision, a petitioner may seek judicial review of any decision of the City pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure Sec. 1094.5 only if the petition for Writ of Mandate pursuant to that section is filed no later than the 90th day following the date on which the City's decision became final.

NOTICE TO PAID REPRESENTATIVES: If you are compensated to monitor, attend, or speak at this meeting, City law may require you to register as a lobbyist and report your activity.
